


FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear WAC family,

I give thanks to God for each of you and the way you have supported the chaplaincy under our care.

Last month we held our SAMS Family Outing at SAFRA Jurong, where more than 30 families and almost 170 people participated. The children enjoyed themselves at the huge indoor playground, while their parents attended an engaging session with our guest speaker, Ms June Tan, who shared practical insights on parenting children with special needs. After the talk, the parents were given time to share their own challenges and struggles in small groups.

This was the first time we intentionally engaged the SAMS parents separately, while our Befrienders and volunteers lovingly cared for the children in their play. It was truly encouraging to witness their joy, laughter, and the bonds formed that day. We plan to follow up with the parents through Zoom sessions to find out if and how they are applying those parenting tips, and to continue supporting them on their parenting journey.
